The mill part has 2 turbines (not working) that used to mill the flour, there is a dam area with sluice gates to control or divert the flow of the river.

Work has been done recently including most of the roof, most electrics, some double glazing and new doors and security cameras, but it is fair to say, although liveable, it merits work to update and enjoy its lovely old features.
