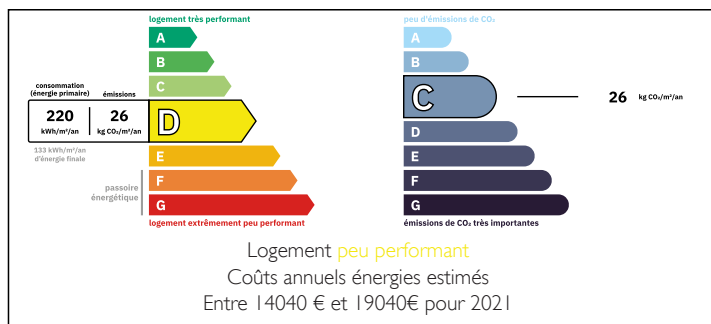

## IN BRIEF

Listed 15th–17th century Renaissance château on 9 hectares of grounds with French-style gardens, terraced ponds, lake, and ancient trees. 900 m<sup>2</sup> of living space with 19 bedrooms (8 suites), historic reception rooms, and a listed chapel. Includes a converted orangery, 250 m<sup>2</sup> event space, professional kitchen with 160 m<sup>2</sup> dining area, and 2 gîtes for 16 guests. Heated pool set in a peaceful, historic landscape. Formerly owned by the De Villeneuve family, with ties to French royalty. A rare opportunity to create a luxury residence or hospitality project in a site steeped in history.

## DESCRIPTION

Set amidst 9 hectares of landscaped grounds, this extraordinary chateau — built between the 15th and 17th centuries in Renaissance style — is officially listed as a Monument Historique of France. A timeless masterpiece, it invites you to walk in the footsteps of nobility, poets, and kings.

Beyond its elegant stone façade, you'll discover 900 m<sup>2</sup> of living space, including 19 bedrooms, 8 of which are suites, and a series of historic reception rooms retaining their original features: stone fireplaces, carved woodwork, and centuries-old parquet.

A listed chapel graces the first floor, while the gardens unfold in true French style, with terraced water basins, a private lake, and century-old trees creating an atmosphere of grandeur and serenity.

Once home to the De Villeneuve family, allies of the Counts of Toulouse and the Kings of France, the chateau still echoes with stories.
