

## DESCRIPTION

This traditional Breton stone longere has been newly renovated and thoughtfully extended to create a lovely new home offering 312m2 of bright and spacious and luminous, versatile living space incorporating 6 bedrooms, 3 en-suite bathrooms, 3 en-suite WC/shower rooms plus guest WC.

This property, with roots tracing back to 17th century, combines traditional charm with modern comfort. Reimagined for contemporary living, it benefits from air-source heat pumps supplying heating and hot water, double glazing in new wooden frames throughout. The result is a character property with solid, energy-efficient infrastructure - where tradition and functionality meet. The resurrection of this ancient property now fittingly referred to as Manoir Le Grand Christo by its current owners, honouring it's 17th c origins.

Set within grounds of 9848m2 this property is steeped in history. The trace of the old Baud road still runs through the grounds, with the original toll gate stone hinge still visible - lending weight to the suggestion that the property may have once served as the mairie - a unique and authentic feature. The setting offers space and privacy without isolation, situated in a hamlet. The grounds offer lots of potential to plant ornamental or fruit trees or as grazing for animals. A low enclosed ruin wall with steps up into it would make a magical kitchen garden and orchard. There's also the option to create a paddock, and the Camors Forest nearby offers...
