

## DESCRIPTION

Upon entering the main house, you are immediately struck by its rich heritage, highlighted by original Girondine floor tiles, exposed oak beams, and period fireplaces. The ground floor includes a magnificent entrance hall leading to a well-equipped kitchen with granite worktops and a Stanley oil-fired range cooker. The kitchen is open to a spacious dining area with French doors leading to an east-facing terrace—perfect for enjoying morning light and countryside views. A formal living room with open fireplace, a library, a charming dining room, and a laundry room complete this level.

The first floor features four beautifully appointed bedrooms, two of which benefit from private en-suite bathrooms, along with a family bathroom. On the second floor, a stunning principal suite showcases an impressive boat-style exposed roof structure, creating a unique and serene atmosphere.

On the lower courtyard level, you'll find the boiler room and ample storage areas.

The estate includes a characterful stone guest house with a vaulted wine cellar and a music studio above with exposed timber framework. The guest house offers an independent apartment comprising an open-plan kitchen and lounge, a bedroom, and a shower room—ideal for guests or seasonal rentals.

Additional buildings include four garages with electric up-and-over doors (one with a car charging point), two stables with adjoining paddocks, a further two stables to the east, and a menage/training arena. There's also a traditional poulailler (chicken coop) and an enclosed vegetable garden area.
