

Nestled on a hillside, in a peaceful hamlet at the end of a quiet lane, this authentic 17th–18th century stone house has retained its original charm (stone walls, spacious volumes, and atmosphere) while offering modern comforts.

The property currently offers 155 m² of total space, including 101 m² of living area, featuring a bright, spacious living room with a wood-burning stove, several well-defined living areas (reading, dining, relaxation), a large, welcoming kitchen, and a sunny south-facing garden perfect for enjoying lunch outdoors.

A workshop-laundry room with direct access to the garden completes this level.

Upstairs, there are 2 bedrooms with a washbasin, as well as a half-level leading to spaces currently set up as bedrooms, an office/studio (not counted as living area today)

Located in a charming hamlet at the end of a quiet lane, this beautiful 17th–18th century stone house, situated between the Vézère and Dordogne valleys, offers a peaceful and authentic setting.

A unique home, combining historical charm with modern comfort.

This lovely stone property features a spacious, light-filled living room (40 m²) thoughtfully arranged into multiple convivial areas: reading corner, dining area, and a lounge with a wood-burning stove.

The large kitchen (21 m²) blends functionality with a welcoming atmosphere. These generous volumes extend onto a south-facing garden, perfect for enjoying the sun from the morning.

Upstairs, there are 2 bedrooms with a washbasin, plus a half-level leading to additional spaces (45 m²) currently used as bedrooms and office/studio areas. These are not counted as living space, offering significant potential for expansion and added value.

Spaces and Potential:

Currently, 101 m^2 of living space is available out of a total of 155 m^2 , with substantial opportunities for development:

2 office spaces

2 bedroom spaces

An attic space under the eaves (10 m²) to be converted into habitable space

An additional attic suitable for conversion (30 m^2) Workshop/laundry room (19 m^2) on the ground floor with direct access to the garden

Outdoors:

The 1,100 m² plot includes a welcoming garden and a 700 m² partially wooded area ideal for a vegetable garden, relaxation area, or swimming pool.

A separate 14 m^2 workshop provides space for crafts or additional storage, and a carport shelters one vehicle.
