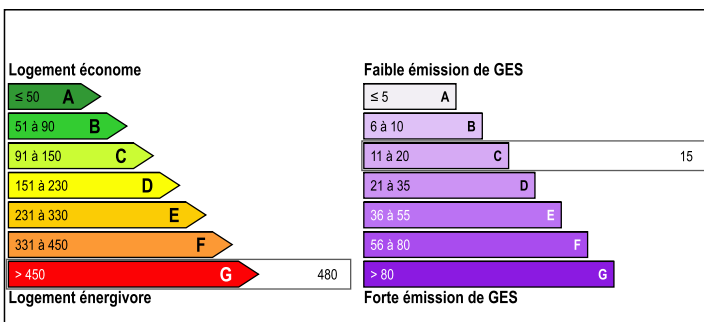

DESCRIPTION

Offering approximately 290m² of living space, together with an extensive attic ready for conversion and a substantial range of attached outbuildings, the possibilities are exceptional. Whether you're dreaming of a magnificent family home or a property with workshop or business potential, this could be an outstanding project.

The property is approached through imposing 3.5-metre-high wrought iron gates, with the entire roadside frontage enclosed by elegant iron railings, creating an immediate sense of grandeur.

The front garden is currently overgrown, as you would expect from a property awaiting renovation, but beneath the mature trees and established shrubs lies the framework of what could once again become a beautiful entrance.

NOTES

To the left of the house is an extensive range of traditional outbuildings, formerly used as workshops, stables, barrel stores and production areas for Cognac, Pineau and wine. These buildings are attached to the main house and offer enormous potential for additional accommodation, studios, workshops or storage.

Ground Floor

The current layout reflects the property's original use, but there is tremendous scope for reimagining the space.

The front door opens directly into the kitchen, which leads to a generous pantry and food preparation room, together with a separate space suitable for creating a ground-floor WC.

Beyond the kitchen is the dining room, with an additional room currently used as a ground-floor bedroom.

Running through the centre of the house is a magnificent entrance hall extending from front to
