IN BRIEF

Situated in a village dripping in history and just beyond the gate of a medieval fortress stands this fabulous cottage, with its carved stone doorways and stone steps up to a high entrance is within a short walk to the village shop and restaurant. There are two relatively high ceiling rooms at street level that have been used as cellars, and 2 first floor rooms with a stone pillared fireplace and niche windows. The property is structurally sound, and the slate roof appears to be in a satisfactory condition with some slates missing at various areas parts of the ridge. Therefore, the price takes into account the need for all necessary work, refurbishment and plumbing. An easily affordable opportunity to own your own authentic piece of history.

DESCRIPTION

Ground level

Room 1 with carved stone entrance (15th/16th century) from the lane only, (used in later epochs as a cellar) exposed stone and ceiling beams (later replacements) and a niche under the entrance stone steps and a second niche with remnants of an earlier stone interior steps to the 1st floor 12,60 m²

Room 2 with carved stone entrance (15th/16th century) from the lane only, (used in later epochs as a cellar) exposed stone and ceiling beams (later replacements) blocked arched feature (possible stone sink) 23,5 m²

Entrance to a tiny courtyard (originally open but now roofed) ancient stone steps to a 1st floor level carved stone entrance door 12 m²

1st Floor

Room 1 with niche window, exposed beams and rear niche area (possible original access to floor below now blocked) 14 m²

Room 2 with niche window, exposed beams and large stone fireplace, ladder access through trap door to the loft area 29 m²

Local shop and restaurants 2-5 minutes' walk

Train station 17 minutes by car

Airport (Brive) 45 minutes by car
