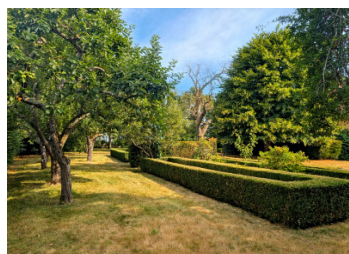


Authentic 16th-century Percheron Manor house, registered historic monument, outbuildings, elegant gardens ...

Perche – 2 hours from Paris – within the Perche regional nature park.

An authentic 16th-century Percheron manor house, registered as a historic monument, in perfect condition, with outbuildings, elegant wooded gardens featuring boxwood, set on 1.17 hectares

The 16th-century manor house consists of a main building surrounded by outbuildings arranged around a rectangular courtyard.

The Manor house is a registered building retaining remarkable decorative features bearing witness to its historical and architectural significance.

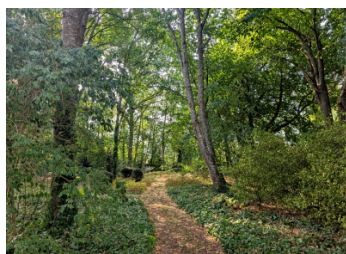

DESCRIPTION

Historic and registered Building

The manor house is distinguished by its remarkable features; these characteristics make it a rare and well-preserved example of a rural seigneurial residence from the Renaissance period in Normandy (original flagstone flooring, painted beams, interlaced letters).

The fief of Le Plessis is first recorded in 1250 and fell under the jurisdiction of the castellany of Bellême. The present building, constructed in the 16th century, has been listed in its entirety as a Listed Building. The outbuildings, typical of rural buildings in the Perche region, and the interior décor bear witness to its historical and architectural significance.

A rich history and also an elegant and comfortable home :

High-quality reception areas and interior décor. Monumental Renaissance

fireplaces, period joinery, massive beams and exposed joists,

floors laid with flagstones. Stone spiral staircase. Converted floor area of approximately 300 m² over two levels.

The property also comprises a guest apartment of 80m².

The current layout offers a total of 6 bedrooms and 4 bathrooms. Further bedrooms could easily be created in the outbuilding.

Elegant wooded gardens, adorned with boxwood, roses and a kitchen garden.
