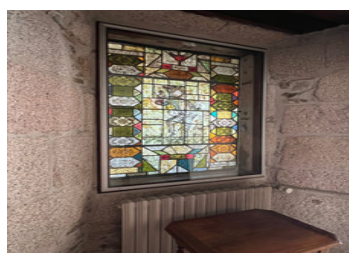
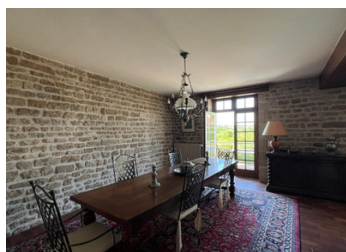


Authentique stone property probable parts dating from Middle Ages. 8 Bedrooms, in the "Old Town" Boussac

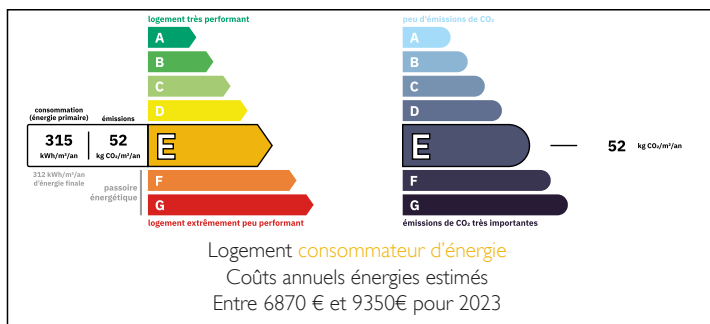

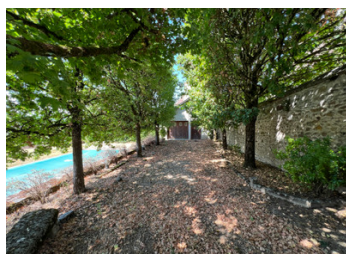
Within the wall's of the Medieval Bourg or "Old Town", walking distance from the Medieval Chateau, it is believed that the majority of the property was once part of the chateau itself. Extended in the '70's, using materials purchased from an abandoned abbey, the property encompasses both the majesty of ancient times, with a more contemporary lifestyle.

DESCRIPTION

This unique property has some wonderful, ancient features, stone spiral staircase, tiled, wooden and stone floors, stone lintels, and fireplaces, ancient doors, stone steps leading down to the vaulted cellar, and stained glass window.

Unusual for a town centre property there is a large garden to the rear, with beautiful, open views, has an inground swimming pool requiring repair or replacement, and a second entrance to a second garage and workshop, and a lime-tree lined boules ground.

The main entrance leads into a corridor, off which is the kitchen, and access to the underground garage (two cars) cellars and central heating boiler (town gas).

The ground floor has a large open plan dining room and lounge, split with a contemporary wood-burner. (+50m²) overlooking the terrace and garden to the rear.

To the rear a corner bureau, overlooked by an unusual stained-glass window. A stone spiral staircase leads to two bedrooms or small apartment, as one leads on to the other, with bathroom and WC. The staircase leads on to large attic spaces.

The second half of the property is now part of the oldest side of the house. A long corridor offers a downstairs room with shower, WC, Sitting room, and day room. Upstairs to this side of the property are a further 4 bedrooms, one with a corner washroom, a bathroom, WC, and outside terrace.
