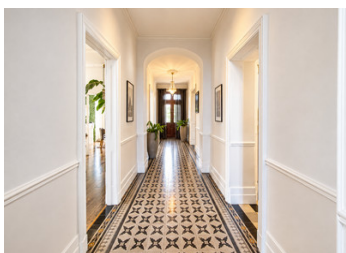

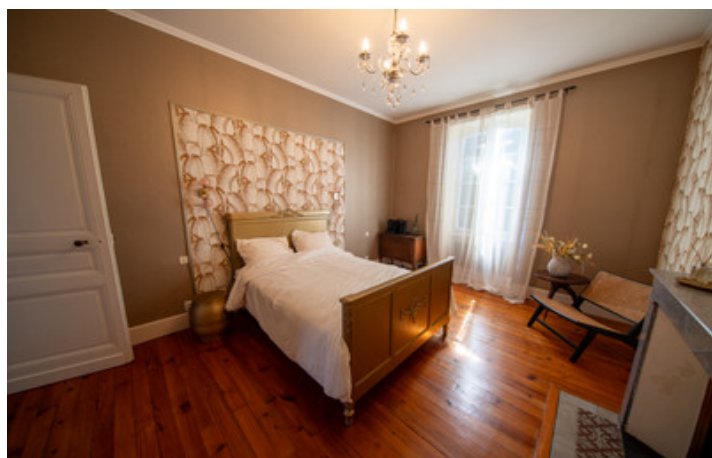

Another particularly attractive feature is that almost all the living rooms, as well as the bedrooms, have their own fireplace, adding warmth, atmosphere and character throughout the house.

RENOVATED WHILE RETAINING ITS SOUL

Since 2022, the house has benefited from a number of improvements and renovation works, including redecoration, insulation, secondary glazing, landscaping and the redistribution of several rooms.

The kitchen was relocated to create a more practical and brighter living space. The former kitchen has been transformed into an office, providing a separate and useful workspace.

There are two convenient entrances to the property: one through the first sitting room, with access to the office, and another through the original main entrance, leading into the long hallway which naturally distributes the ground floor.

This level includes two sitting rooms, a dining room, the newly fitted kitchen, a WC and a utility room with direct access to the garden.

The generous proportions and natural flow of the house make it particularly well suited to comfortable family living, while retaining all the charm and atmosphere of a traditional period residence.

UPSTAIRS: FAMILY ACCOMMODATION AND FURTHER POTENTIAL

The beautiful oak staircase leads to the first floor, where the bedrooms and newly created shower room are located.

The house currently offers five bedrooms. One of the bedrooms also benefits from its own dressing room, providing an additional level of comfort and storage.

The shower room has been thoughtfully fitted with a walk-in shower, twin washbasins and WC.
