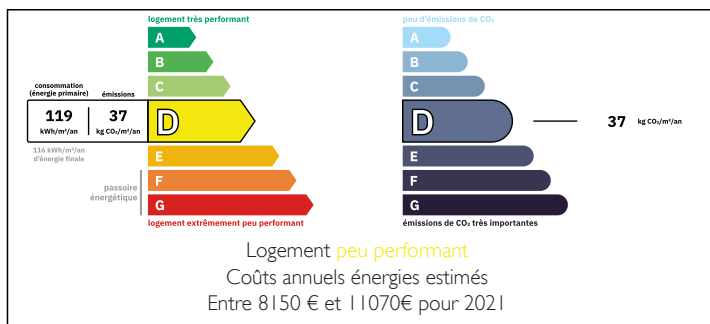

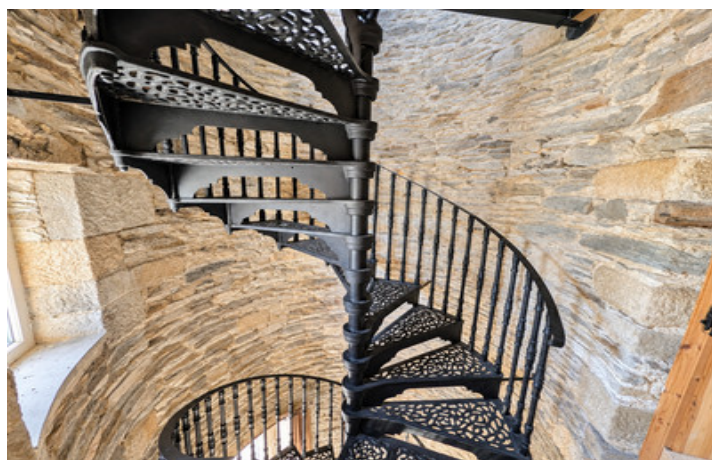
Dating in part from around 1300, this remarkable manor of approximately 543 m² offers 10 bedrooms, spacious reception rooms and nearly 680 m² of workshops and outbuildings, all set within a 5.6-hectare estate. Approximately 4.8 hectares are laid to grass, making the property particularly suitable for horses. Formerly used for the storage, maintenance and restoration of classic cars, the ancillary buildings offer exceptional potential for a collector, equestrian use, a tourism or events project, or a professional activity, subject to the necessary permissions. The property combines centuries of history, generous proportions, an unspoilt rural setting and a D-rated Energy Performance Certificate (DPE). This property would make a fantastic bed and breakfast or retreat.

DESCRIPTION

This remarkable historic property is located in Plévin, Côtes-d'Armor, in the heart of Brittany, and extends over approximately 5.6 hectares.

The oldest parts of the manor are believed to date from around 1300. Extended and altered over the centuries, the house retains the character and atmosphere of a substantial historic Breton property while offering space and accommodation suited to contemporary family life.

The manor provides approximately 543 m² of living space arranged over three floors, with nine bedrooms, numerous shower rooms and bathrooms, as well as spacious reception areas.

In addition, there are approximately 680 m² of buildings, workshops and storage areas. These were previously used for the storage, maintenance and restoration of classic cars, providing a particularly rare feature.

Approximately 4.8 hectares of the estate consist of pasture and grassland, offering an attractive configuration for owners of horses or other animals, subject to the necessary facilities and improvements.

A fountain positioned in front of the manor adds to the charm of the approach and reinforces the historic character of the property.

Ground Floor

The ground floor is primarily dedicated to living and reception areas.

The main entrance, positioned centrally on the façade, provides access to the different parts of the house.
